## **Criminalistics Excellence Award**

### **Case of the Year Patrol**

Our awards program is sponsored by Criminalistics, Inc. This program recognizes outstanding work done by K-9 teams in the everyday encounter with the real world. This award is presented to the team that has been selected as having performed exceptionally under difficult circumstances and with exceptional ability in law enforcement utilizing a police service dog. The award is selected by the USPCA National Vice-presidents for the best patrol case and the best detector case for each quarter. The winners of the quarterly awards then compete for the Case of the Year Award.

**The Case of the Year for 2009 is:**

#### **2009 Criminalistics Award of Excellence Top Patrol Case**

**Officer Pat Murphy and K9 Boomer  
Saint Paul Police Dept.**

On April 6, 2009, at 18:12 hours, Officer Murphy responded to the area of 1561 Iowa Street, where a suspect with a handgun was seen milling about in the alley. It was further reported that the suspect had fired the pistol and was smoking a substance out of an empty pop can.

Being familiar with the area, Officer Murphy approached from the west end of the alley, behind the address. As he turned the corner into the alley, he was immediately confronted by the suspect who was seated, leaning against a garage. He also noticed that the suspect had set down an unknown object behind an adjacent telephone pole when he had turned the corner.

Officer Murphy got out of his squad, and at gunpoint, immediately began ordering the suspect to show his hands. The suspect was initially compliant, following commands to lie prone on the ground. Officer Murphy broadcast his situation and waited for back up officers to arrive. As he waited, the suspect began asking, "What's going on?" Officer Murphy told him that he would explain everything in a moment and further warned him to stay on the ground or he would send his dog to apprehend him.

Four officers arrived and took positions to cover Officer Murphy's left and right. Officer Murphy coordinated the arrest teams approach, utilizing two officers armed with long guns; the remaining officers were armed with their handguns in preparation of going "hands on" with the suspect. (One of the arrest team described the suspect's behavior as appearing to be "sizing up" the officers or "trying to make a decision."

As the team began their approach, the suspect began to move, starting to stand up. The team stopped their approach, and Officer Murphy ordered the suspect to get back down on the ground or he would send his dog.

Despite several commands, the suspect continued to stand up. Rather than continue the approach towards the possibly armed man, Officer Murphy deployed K-9 Boomer to make the apprehension. K-9 Boomer apprehended the suspect by his right arm, but Officer Murphy saw that the suspect did not react to the dog's apprehension. The suspect appeared unfazed by what was occurring and instead of complying with the continued commands, he attempted to fight the dog. (It was later learned that the suspect had .388 blood alcohol content and was bent on suicide.) As he did so, he reached down and retrieved the object that Officer Murphy saw him set down. That object was revealed to be a loaded .357 magnum revolver. The officers ordered the suspect to drop the gun, but he failed to comply. He, instead, raised the pistol, pointing it at the arrest team. As Officer Murphy was drawing his handgun, several of the officers fired their weapons at the suspect. The suspect was struck by several rounds and fell backwards, all the while maintaining his grip on his handgun. When the suspect hit the ground, the weapon fell free from his grasp. The arrest team made a tactical approach, kicking the gun away from the mortally-wounded suspect and took him into custody. When the team made contact, Officer Murphy saw that K-9 Boomer had sustained a gunshot wound to his muzzle and was bleeding heavily. Officer Murphy immediately placed Boomer in his squad and rushed him to the University of Minnesota Veterinary clinic for treatment. As he was rushing to the clinic, K-9 Boomer continued to bark and was extremely agitated, accelerating his blood loss. K-9 Boomer's wounds consisted of a round going completely through his upper muzzle blowing out three of his teeth. The damage to Boomer's muzzle, while severe, was secondary to the massive amount of blood he had lost. In total, it took three surgeries and numerous transfusions to stabilize and save K-9 Boomer's life. Officer Murphy and his K-9 partner, Boomer, responded to this critical incident and were immediately confronted by the suspect. Officer Murphy controlled the encounter, dealing with the suspect while updating arriving squads. Once squads were on scene, he coordinated their approach in a tactical manner. As the situation deteriorated, Officer Murphy showed sound judgment, utilizing his K-9 partner, Boomer, in an attempt to gain compliance. K-9 Boomer made the critical first contact with the suspect, allowing the officers to maintain positions of cover, while Boomer dealt with the threat. K-9 Boomer apprehended and held the suspect, handicapping the suspect's actions. K-9 Boomer displayed incredible courage and focus, suffering a gunshot wound during the encounter. What became known in the aftermath of this incident revealed that the suspect was intent on ending his life. Unfortunately, it appeared that his plan was to take a police officer with him. It is highly likely that without utilization of the police service dog, officers may have lost their lives. K-9 Boomer has made a full recovery and is back in service, continuing to protect Officer Murphy, his partners and the citizens of Saint Paul.

## **Monza Award**

**The Monza Award is presented to the handler of a K-9 killed in the line of duty.**

### **History of the Monza Award**

This award is named after Mr. Don Bartel's first dog, K-9 Monza.

On October 7, 1969, at about 03:00, Metropolitan D.C. Police Officer Don Bartel & K-9 Monza responded to a business burglary and apprehended five burglars. Later that morning, K-9 Monza was very uncomfortable, and Don knew he was seriously ill. The dog was rushed to the department's veterinarian's office. K-9 Monza was in stress from the early morning encounter with the five burglars and died in Don's arms. The Monza Award was established in Richmond, Virginia, in 1969.
